Bovati on the missing center—hermeneutical reflections on the method of (biblical) rhetorical analysis, with specific reference to structures without a center; L. M. Almendra on horizons of mystery and of wisdom in God—the sequence of Job 28; D. Vitulli on YHWH as father of his people—Psalm 127; M. Cuypers on Semitic rhetoric in the Quran and in some Pharaonic texts; M. L. Caruso on the commandment of God and human traditions—the sequence in Mk 6:45-7:30; C. Quispe on the new teaching of Jesus—the sequence of Mk 11:27-12:44; B. Standaert on Mark's Gospel and its composition; V. R. Solichin on the light of the word and the gift of listening—the composition of the parables discourse in Mark 4; Meynet on how to prepare exercises of rhetorical analysis; and Meynet on an exercise of rhetorical analysis—Psalm 111.
